### Mission Statement

Working together, the Sunrise Mountain High School community empowers each student to master academic and social standards, embrace rigor, develop meaningful relationships, graduate, and become a responsible member of a diverse society.

### Principal's Highlights

Sunrise Mountain High School is dedicated to providing our students with an exceptional academic program. We offer a warm and caring environment with a knowledgeable, talented and friendly staff.

- Increased the graduation rate from 61.4% to 67.07% which is a gain of 20% in just 2 years.
- Increased the number of Advanced Placement classes offered by 75%.
- Increased the number of seats in Advanced Placement classes from 355 seats to 947 seats.
- Increased the number of students earning an advanced diploma from 17.7% to 20.5%.
- Maintained a Tardy Lock-Out policy which reduced student tardies by over 90%.
- Maintained the 4 x 4 block schedule which allows students to earn additional credits necessary for graduation, academic interventions, and enrichment.
- Provided a double-block intervention for 9th grade students in ELA and math.
- Enrolled non-proficient 12th graders in Math Applications, Science Foundations, and Reading/Writing proficiency classes.

### Goals and Objectives

#### Goal 1

Increase the percentage of students graduating each year.

#### Objective(s):

Enroll non-proficient 12th grade students in 80 minutes of math and ELA instruction every day.  
Enroll non-proficient 12th grade students in science proficiency support classes.  
Provide credit retrieval for credit deficient 12th grade students.  
Utilize block schedule to increase opportunities to earn credit  
Provide support instruction for all IEP and ELL population.  
Provide proficiency tutoring with highly qualified math, ELA, and science instructors.  
Offer proficiency boot camps in the weeks immediately preceding the administration of the NHSPE.

#### Goal 2

Increase the number of students completing Advanced Placement and Career and Technical Education courses each year.

#### Objective(s):

Ensure students will read, write, listen, and speak in every classroom, every day.  
Implement the SpringBoard/College Board curriculum in every ELA classroom.  
Realign the curriculum and eliminate Honors classes in Social Studies to push students to enroll in AP classes.  
Enroll all English 9 Honors students in AP Human Geography.  
All students are eligible to enroll in AP courses.

#### Goal 3

Increase the percentage of school-based personnel trained in Cultural Competency.

#### Objective(s):

100% of staff will participate in a cultural competency professional development during the 2015-2016 school year.

### School Communication Efforts

Parental engagement is essential to student success. At Sunrise Mountain High School, we encourage parental participation. Parents and community members are involved in academic, co-curricular and extracurricular activities. Parents have the opportunity to serve on a number of committees including the Parent Advisory Committee, School Improvement Planning Committee, Innovative School Team, Technology Committee, and Attendance/Discipline Committee.
